#### Mental Health Co-Responder

# **SPECIAL OPERATIONS**

### <u>Aviation</u>

Aviation performed overwatch during two narcotics search warrants as well as a traffic stop leading from one of the search warrants. In mid-December, Air1 followed a vehicle pursuit that led into Metro Nashville and located the subject (who was arrested); they similarly followed a vehicle pursuit that began in Spring Hill and ended in Cool Springs when the vehicle crashed out. Air1 located that vehicle and assisted in locating the fleeing subjects. Four subjects were taken into custody after a foot pursuit. They also assisted CID in the search for a stolen four-wheeler, and participated in the Leiper's Fork Christmas parade.


#### Crime Prevention






No Sheriff's Sale occurred, and no arrests were made under the efforts of the US Marshals Task Force. Warrants personnel completed 80 training hours during the month.
