Crashes Worked by WCSO June 2024



SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Special Ops reviewed the TN RenFest operations in an after-action meeting following the multi-weekend community event throughout the month of May. With the Williamson County Fair approaching, preparations are ramping up including a monthly planning meeting. There was also a meeting involving fleet maintenance for an upcoming transition of body and dash cam recording vendor and equipment. Special Ops also engaged with the community via a Touch-a-Truck event.

Aviation

Aviation flights included searches for a missing juvenile, a robbery suspect in Spring Hill, a suicidal suspect in Hickman County, and narcotics buy/surveillance with the DEA in another county. They also assisted K-9 and Traffic units on the interstates during Bonnaroo Festival to intercept drugs and other illegal activity traveling through our area, and provided overwatch to the Traffic unit while they participated in a Hands Free Campaign for safety on the roads. Aviation also met with the community via a Tollgate Subdivision Parade and Touch-a-Truck.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS (SRO) & CRIME PREVENTION

SRO Activity

School is on summer break from late May until the start of the 2024-2025 school year. WCS begins a student half-day on Monday, August 5, 2024, and FSSD begins their first student half-day on Wednesday, August 7, 2024.

Crime Prevention

During June, Crime Prevention eases off the hectic end-of-school-year pace and shifts from active education sessions to a planning period, focusing on the curriculum of the upcoming fiscal year. June is heavily dedicated to revising and updating the lesson plans for litter education, internet safety, elderly scam prevention, and bike/public safety. This time is essential for the success of the programs for the upcoming year, allowing WCSO to review them with a detailed eye for improvements and expansions.

Five hours were still dedicated to community immersion, including the Stonebridge Community Neighborhood Watch Meeting. This meeting established their block captains and structure of how the watch will operate. It should be noted that the community is very organized and involved with the Neighborhood Watch, and they are truly invested in its overall success.




