





The co-responder position is vacant as of the end of September. Until VBHCS fills this position or an alternative solution is found, WCSO is utilizing Tennessee's Mobile Crisis Services when needed. No co-responder monthly data is available for October.

Crime Prevention

In local schools, internet safety lectures continue to be one of the most in-demand requests made of the division, who gave such presentations over three days at College Grove Elementary. When Thompson Station Middle School held their Red Ribbon Week during the last week of October, Crime Prevention participated with two lectures. First, students were encouraged to make healthy choices and to remain substance free in a presentation on the 29th. Next, a lecture on Halloween focused on basic traffic safety to remind students to take their own safety seriously and maintain spatial awareness.

Additionally, Crime Prevention aided in hosting the Tennessee Sheriff's Association when sheriffs from across the state congregated locally for a meeting. Nissan Headquarters held their annual Trunk-or-Treat where over 1,000 people attended, and many of them met with WCSO for candy and conversation. Local apartment complex, Southaven, also held a Trunk-or-Treat and WCSO was one of the main booths in attendance. The College Grove Tractor Supply requested our attendance at their Hometown Heroes Kickoff Event, which highlighted appreciation for first responders and military members.

The monthly county convenience center checks were performed to replace any boxes if needed and to restock personalsized litterbags. Crime Prevention spent approximately 36 hours in community immersion for the month.


