The Laurelbrooke Community continues to operate the Neighborhood Watch program. Temple Hills invited WCSO to their HOA meeting to receive input on the benefits and necessity for license plate readers (LPRs). The Sheriff's Office received positive feedback from all attendees.

As always, Crime Prevention conducted the monthly convenience center checks for restocking and pertinent equipment replacement. Crime Prevention spent approximately 32.5 hours in community immersion for the month.
