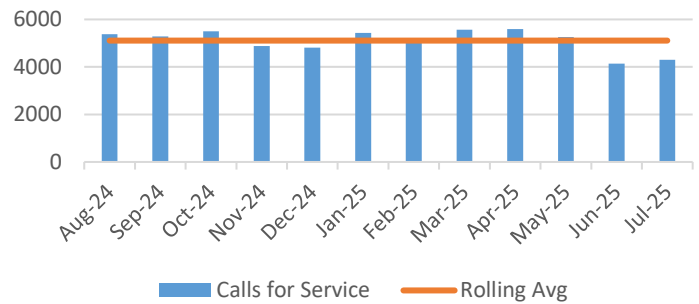
WCSO received 37 applications and progressed 9 into the background phase. There were 2 new hires.

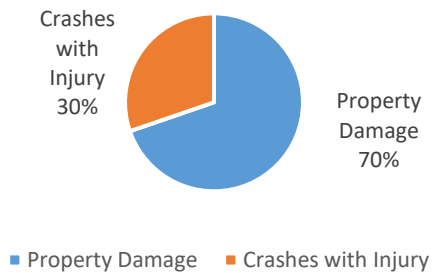
# Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area July 2025



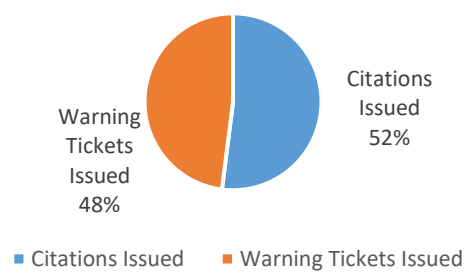

## SPECIAL OPERATIONS

### Aviation

All three helicopters practiced for and participated in the funeral fly over for the late WCSO Detention Deputy Andrew Ryan. Air1 flew over a dozen patrolling flights during the month. They also directly assisted Patrol Division on several traffic stops, reckless driver BOLOs, and in locating reported motor vehicle crashes. To assist other divisions, Aviation took aerial pictures for school safety preparation and flew surveillance for an upcoming CID search warrant. For community interaction, the Huey was flown to the Grove for a career day event.

### Crime Prevention

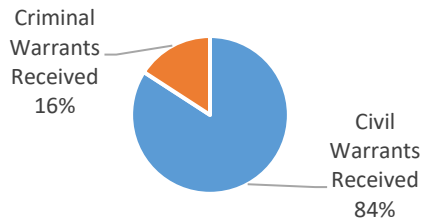
Crime Prevention was present at the City of Fairview's annual 3<sup>rd</sup> of July Festival, which was attended by tens of thousands of citizens. The libraries in Franklin and College Grove both hosted Story Time with a Sheriff this month; this event allows our youngest members of the community to listen to a deputy read a story that highlights the life of a law enforcement officer. They may then ask questions and chat with the deputy in the safe and comfortable environment of our local libraries. WCSO also visited Spring Hill Academy on July 15<sup>th</sup> for their Community Helpers Day. Students at the daycare learned about the different jobs offered at the Sheriff's Office, and then got an up-close look at a patrol vehicle with opportunities to sit inside and take photos. The last event of the month was a visit to the small childcare facility at St. John's Place, including another story time and Q&A. The second half of the month was dedicated to county fair preparation. Monthly convenience center checks were conducted for litterbag supply restock and equipment inspection/replacement. Crime Prevention spent approximately 15.5 hours in community immersion for the month.

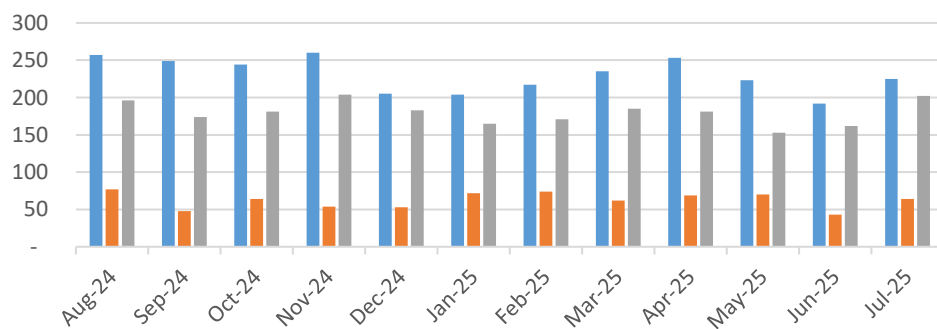

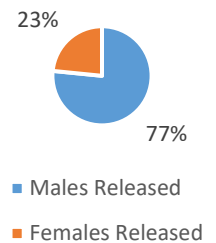

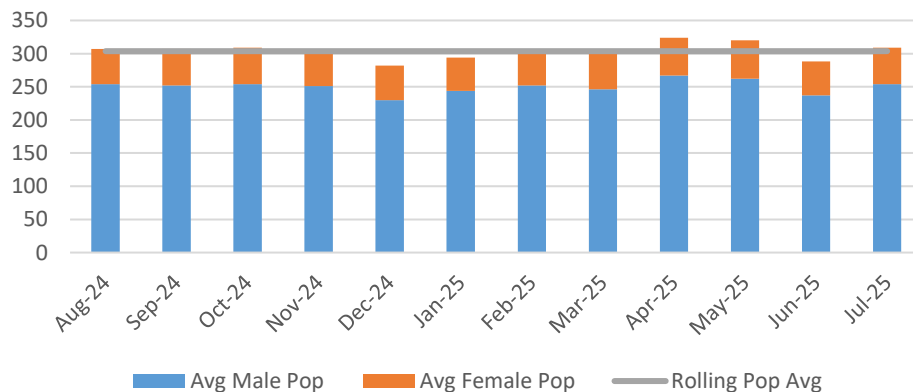
Detention Bookings
