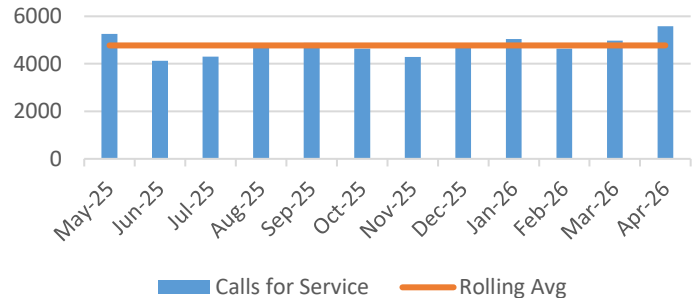

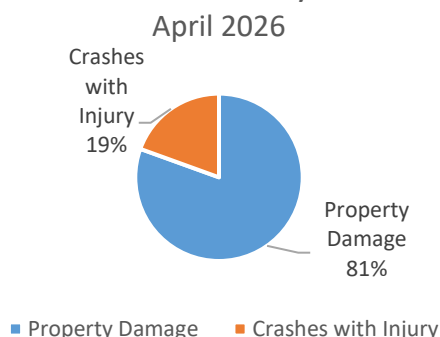
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area April 2026



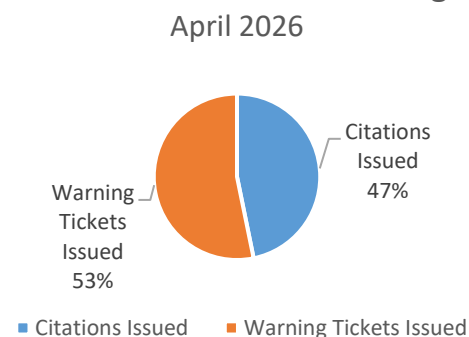

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

For internal activity, Aviation performed frequent patrolling flights and aided response in two reported active shooter calls (both determined to be a hoax). They further assisted Patrol to BOLO for a reckless motorcycle driver, a reckless dump truck driver, and both Patrol and county fire departments with locating a structure fire. Air1 worked with Narcotics for overwatch on a search warrant execution. They also successfully followed a suspect vehicle back all through Nashville where Narcotics Investigators could not follow from the ground after they completed a planned drug deal.

April was heavy with mutual aid and community events. Air1 went on a night call-out for an escaped patient from Rolling Hills Hospital, assisted Spring Hill PD with aerial surveillance for a future operation, response for a nighttime burglary, and Spring Hill SWAT with a search warrant operation. They also successfully located a missing juvenile when dispatched to Cheatham County. Air1 located the juvenile in the middle of the woods, and led deputies to her location so she was returned home safely. They also performed a flyover for the funeral of a Dickson County Sheriff's Office Detective and one for the Tunnel to Towers Foundation Home Give-Away event. Aviation was present at multiple school events, a preschool Touch-a-Truck event, a Hillsboro School Easter event, and Easter Egg Drops at Rolling Hills Church and Franklin Heritage Church of Christ. There were also training and maintenance flights.

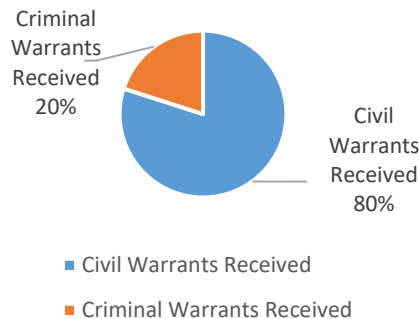

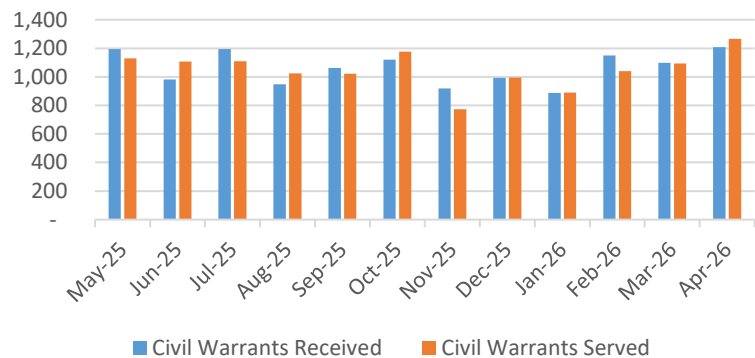

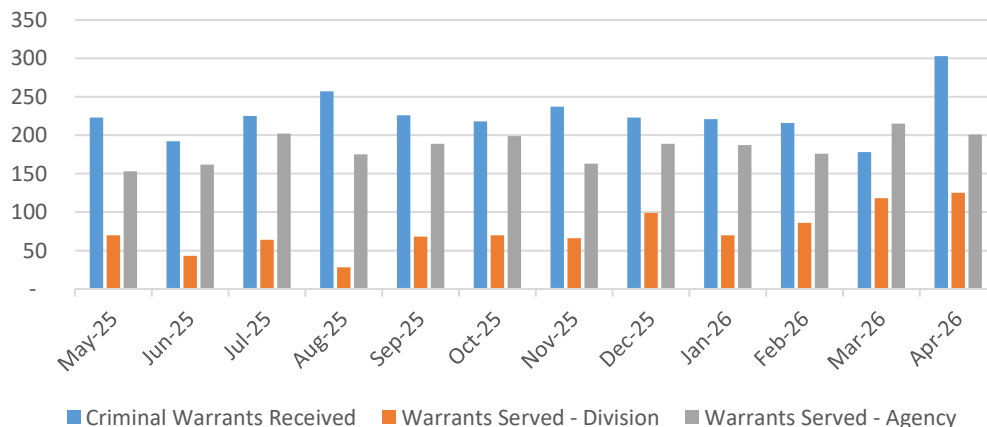
Warrants Received by WCSO

Civil Warrants Received & Served



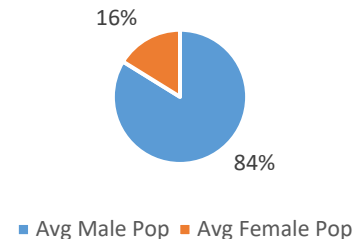
Criminal Warrants Received & Served



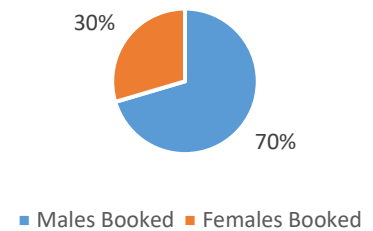

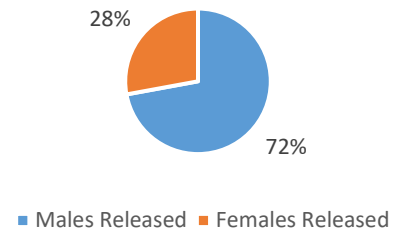
Population Averages
April 2026



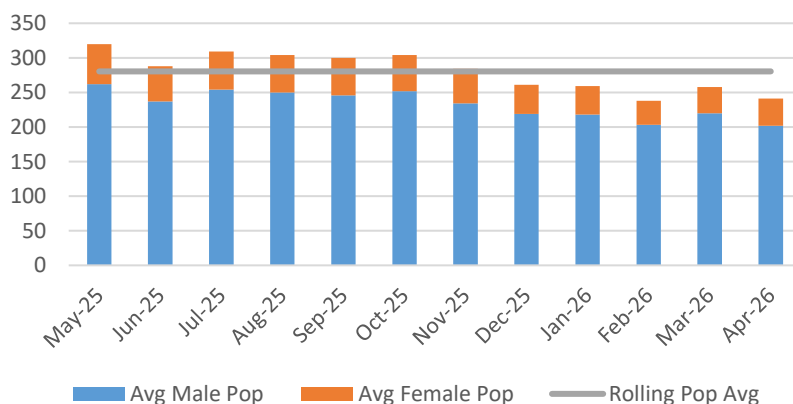
Detention Bookings
