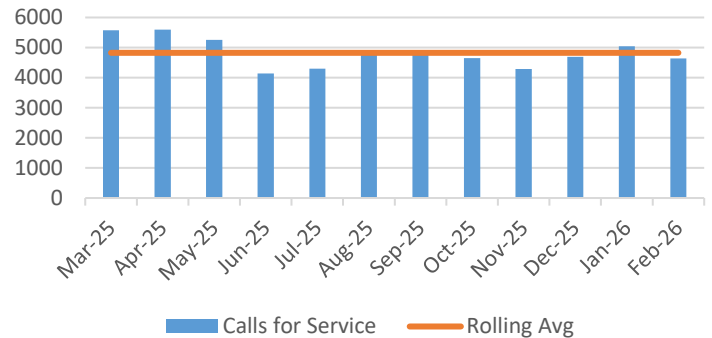
WCSO received 41 applications and progressed 7 to additional background process. There were 5 new hires (all Detention) and 1 termination from the agency.

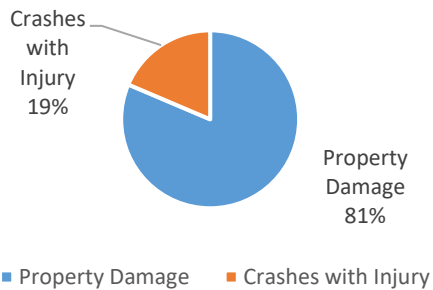
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area February 2026



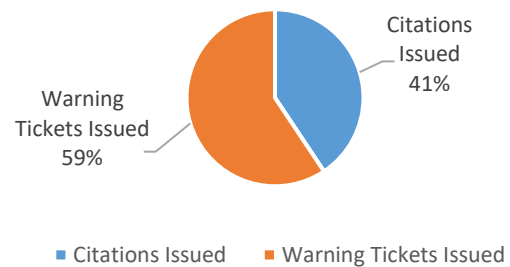

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

February was a busy month for the Aviation unit, which continued with another flight for ongoing assessment of damage from the January ice storms. Air1 was present in the community for school events at Spring Meadows Academy, and took aerial photos for Page High School's popular annual event: Drive Your Tractor to School Day. Additionally, they were dispatched to calls for a possible home invasion, a small aircraft crash, a motorcycle pursuit, and another vehicle/foot pursuit. In both pursuits, Air1 located the subjects. They also located the plane crash and landed to help the pilot (thankfully, there were no injuries). There were multiple proactive patrolling flights and overwatch for Patrol on calls when possible, and a mutual aid assist for THP on a vehicle pursuit. There were also training flights, maintenance flights, and mechanics runs.

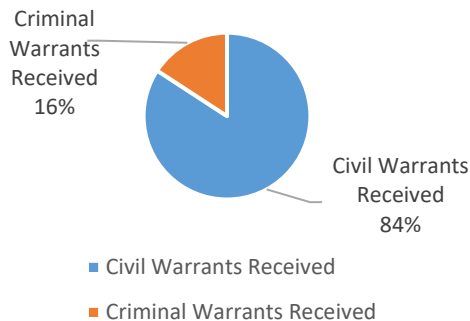

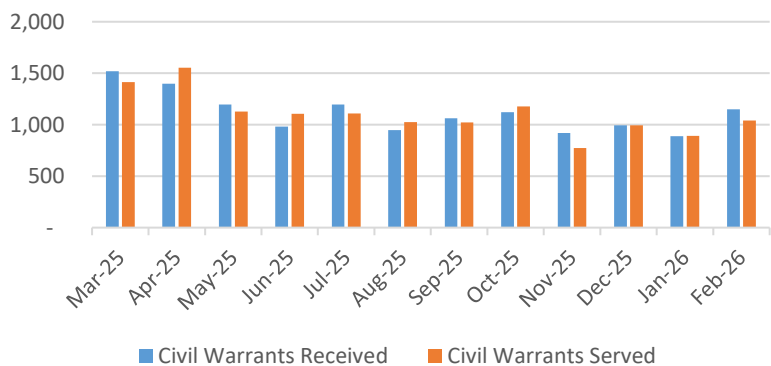

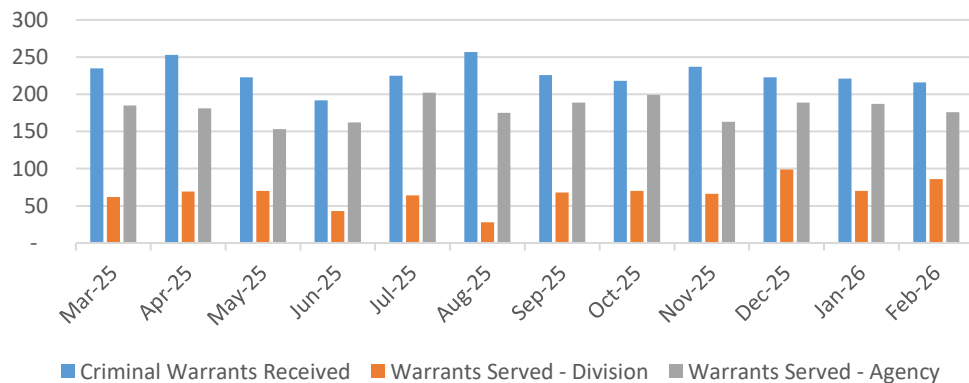
Warrants Received by WCSO

Civil Warrants Received & Served



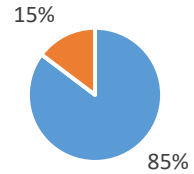
Criminal Warrants Received & Served

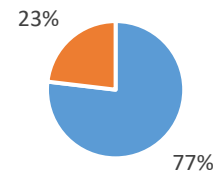

February 2026



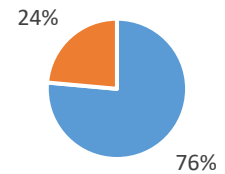

February 2026



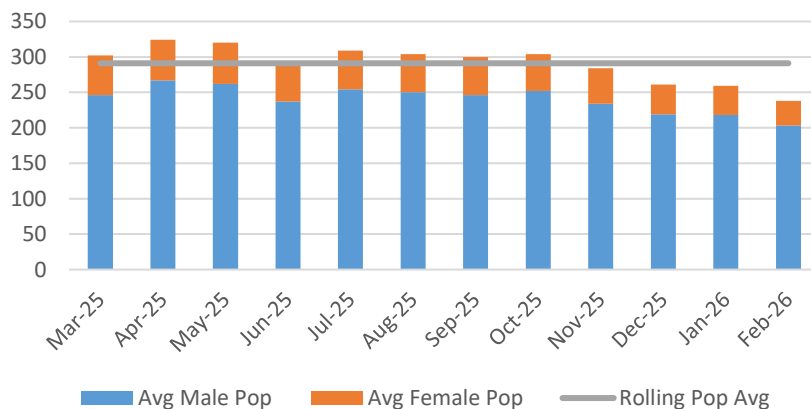
■ Males Booked ■ Females Booked
