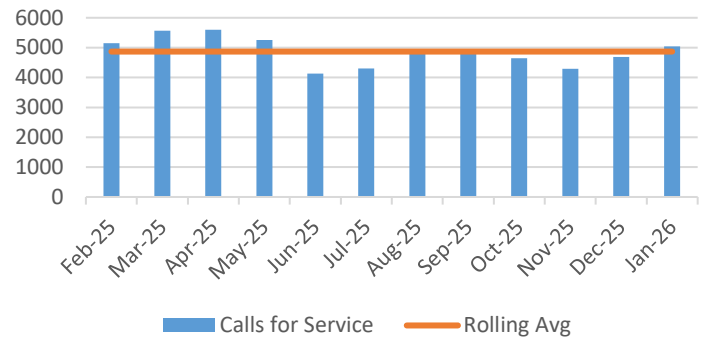

Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area

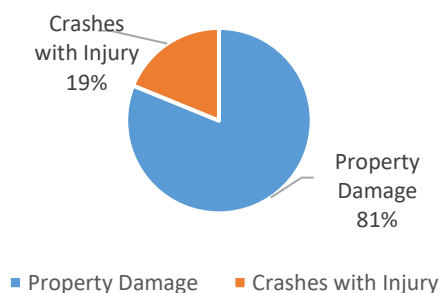

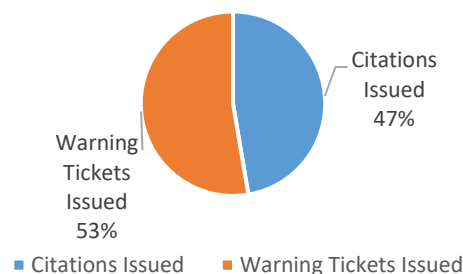

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

On January 5, Air1 had the honor of performing a funeral flyover for a Blount County Sheriff's Office Deputy killed in the line of duty. They provided assistance for Narcotics in follow-ups from a drug deal, and assisted Patrol with locating a residential structure fire. Aviation also performed overwatch on several traffic stops throughout the month, in addition to multiple general aviation patrol flights, instrument training flights, and "cross-country" training flights (Centerville Airport). After the winter storms impacted the area, Air1 also flew Middle Tennessee Electric executives and local EMA to assess damages from the ice storms.

The majority of planned activities for the month had to be cancelled due to the severe winter weather closing county schools for the week of January 25.

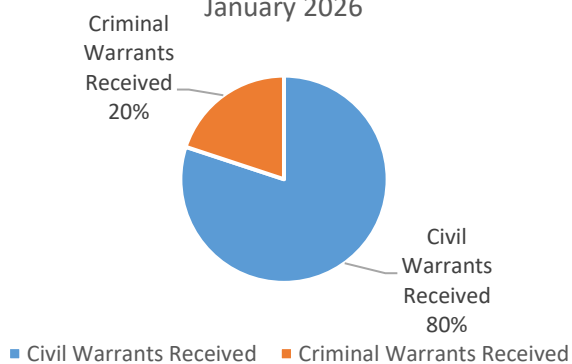
Crime Prevention spent approximately 10.5 hours in community immersion for the month.

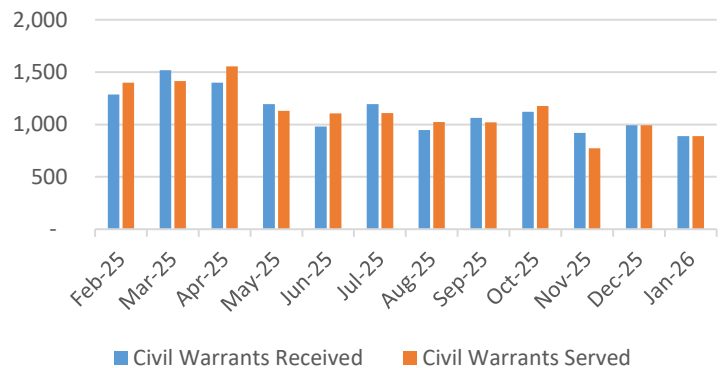

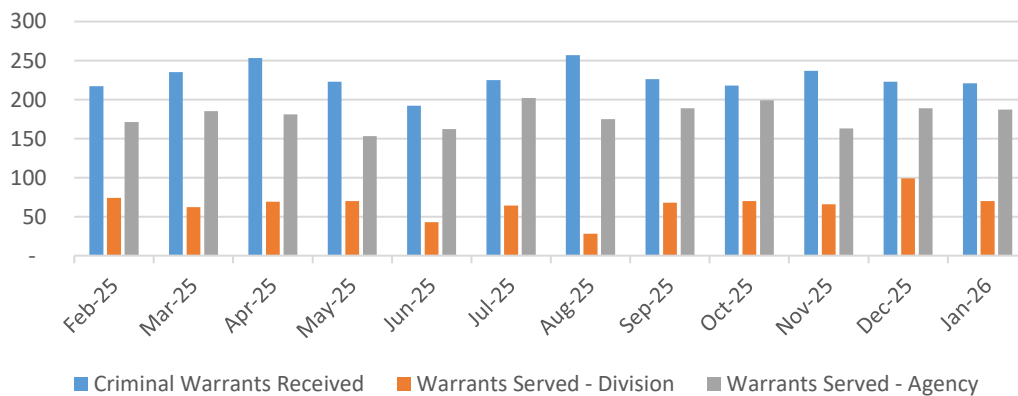
Warrants Received by WCSO

Civil Warrants Received & Served



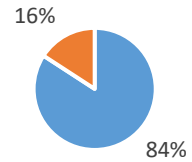
Criminal Warrants Received & Served

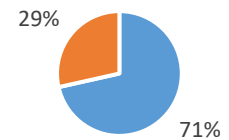

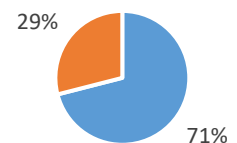
■ Avg Male Pop ■ Avg Female Pop

January 2026



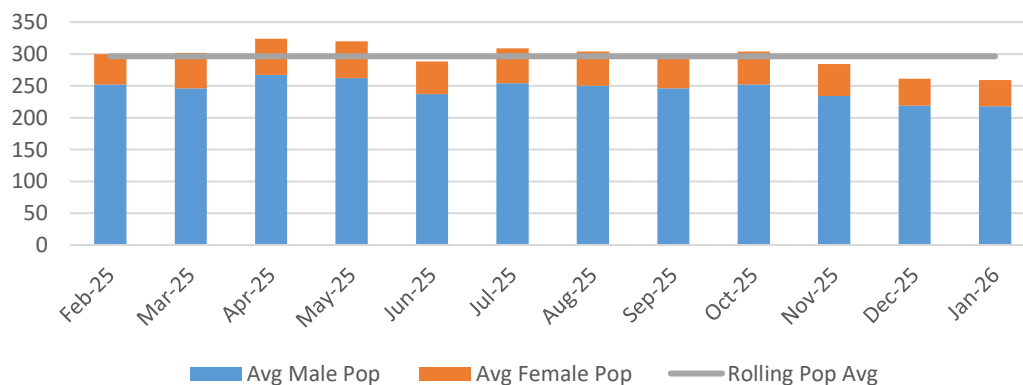
