Hiring and Retention Efforts

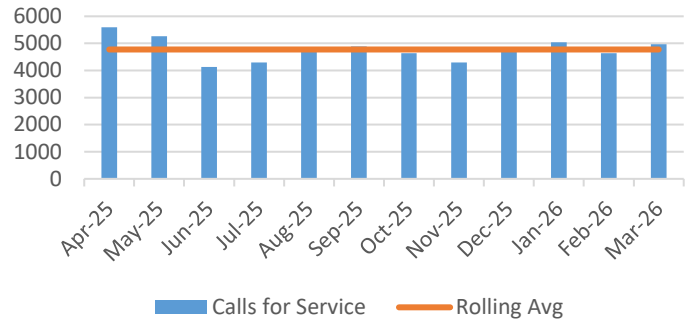

Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area

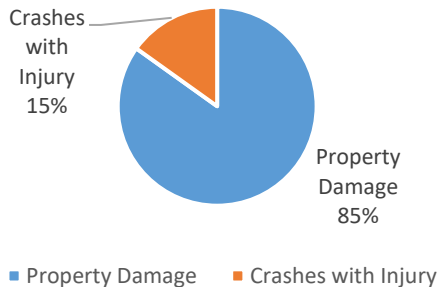

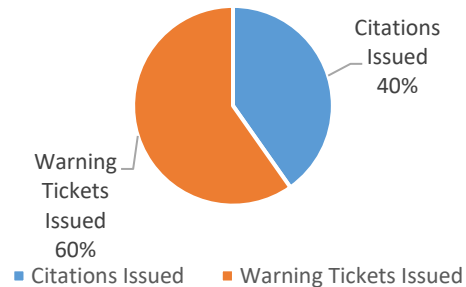

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

Aviation focused heavily on patrolling and training flights in March, working on skills in instrument training, windy conditions, cross-country training, and pattern practice. Air1 assisted Patrol on a silent alarm call, with BOLOS for reckless drivers (including a motorcycle driving 110 mph), and was dispatched for aerial search of a missing elderly male. The citizen was located at a neighbor's house. In community engagement, Aviation flew to the Nolensville Elementary Spring Carnival event, and for an Egg Drop/Touch-a-Truck event at Heritage Church of Christ in Franklin. Air1 also paid respects via funeral flyover for a retired out-of-state police officer.

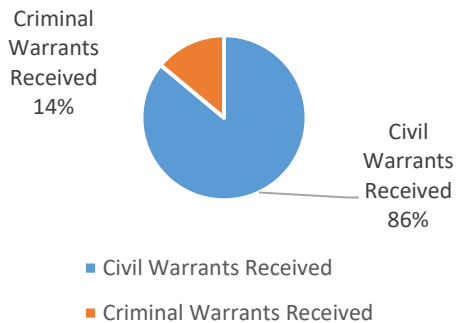

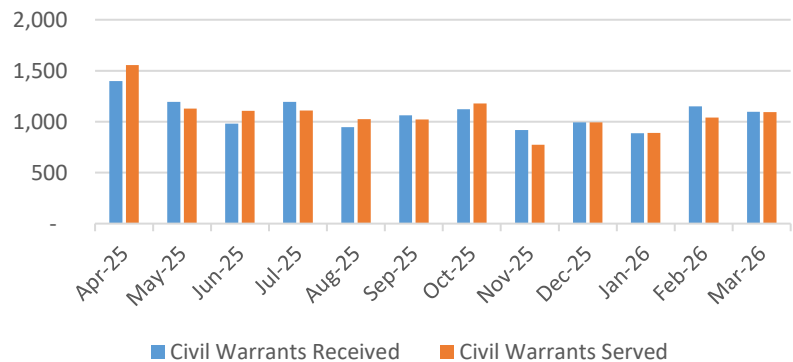

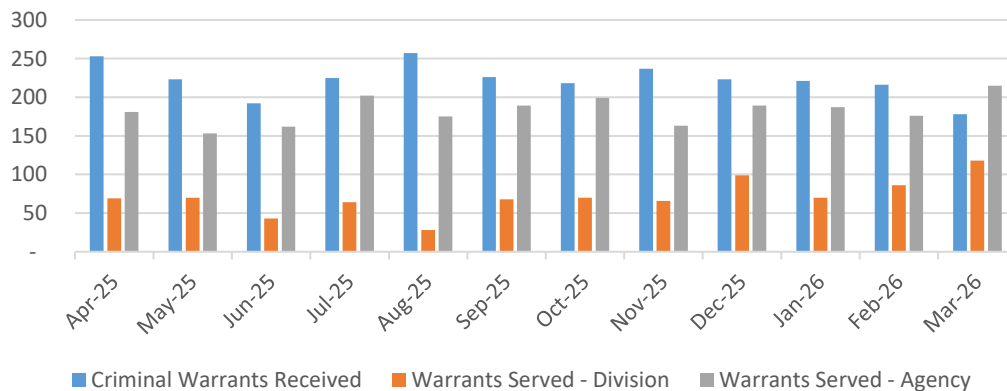
Warrants Received by WCSO

Civil Warrants Received & Served



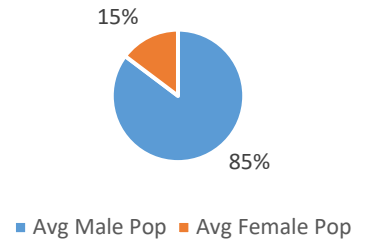
Criminal Warrants Received & Served



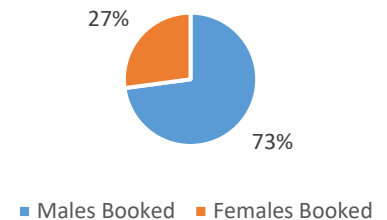

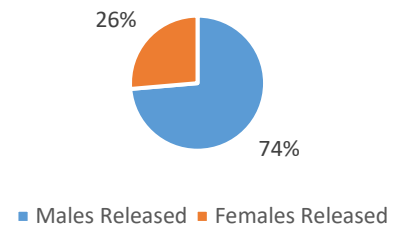
Population Averages
March 2026



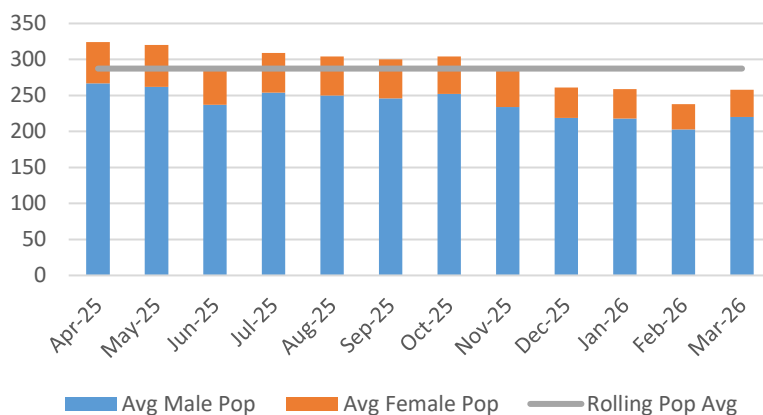
Detention Bookings
