Hiring and Retention Efforts

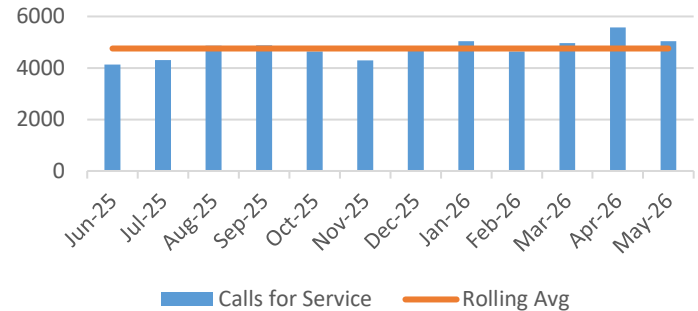

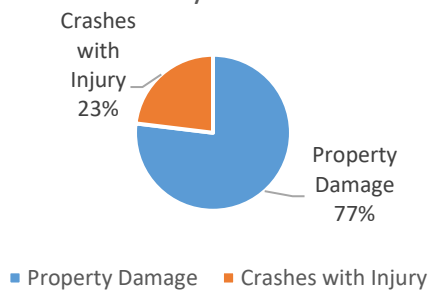
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area May 2026



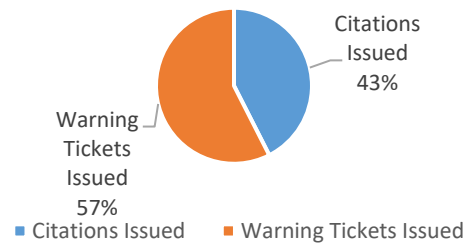

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

Air1 was dispatched for a missing elderly citizen (who was located), for two runaway juveniles from a DCS home in the Spring Hill area, for reports of a suspicious armed subject, and for a foot pursuit in Hickman County. They also performed overwatch on multiple traffic stops and for the Franklin Rodeo Parade, in addition to over a dozen routine patrol flights.

There was also community engagement aplenty with a flight for class members of Leadership Franklin, school events at Walnut Grove Elementary, Allendale Elementary, and Winstead Elementary, as well as a Franklin City Touch-a-Truck Event at Jim Warren Park. Aviation and WCSO also focused on future planning with four drone training flights and assorted training flights for the pilots and system familiarization.

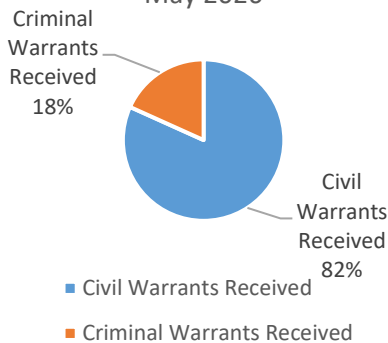

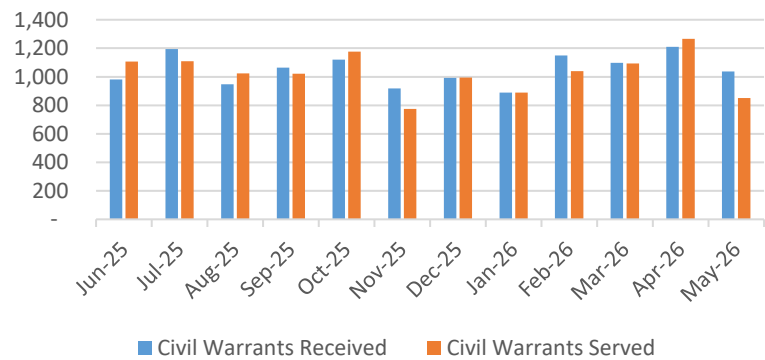

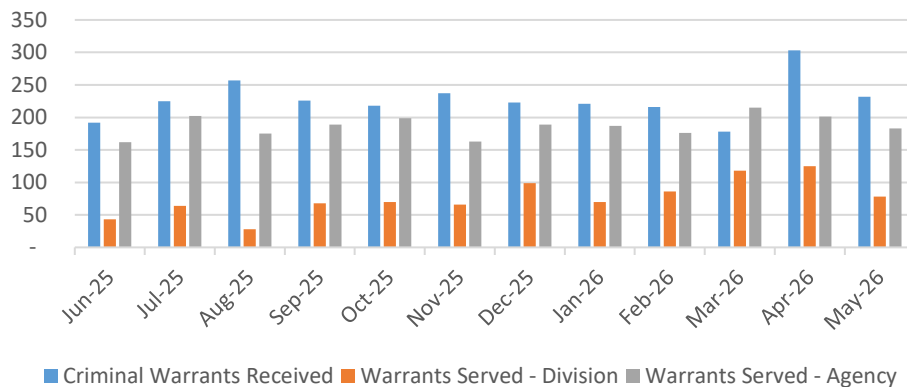
Warrants Received by WCSO

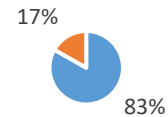

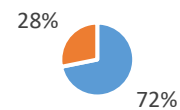


■ Avg Male Pop

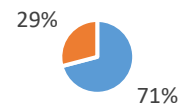


■ Males Booked

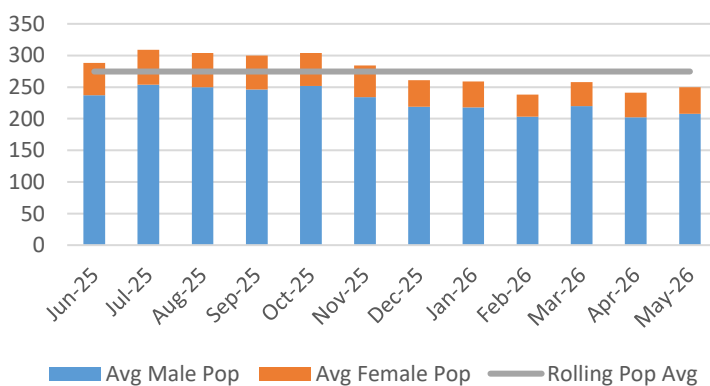
