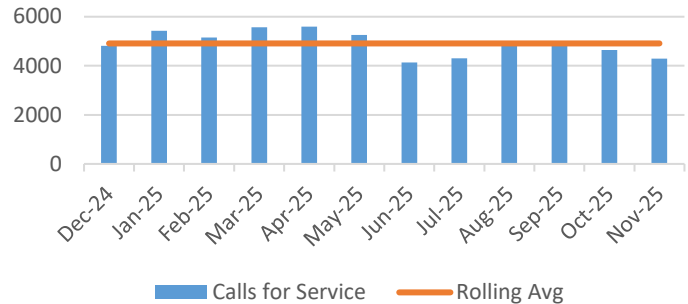

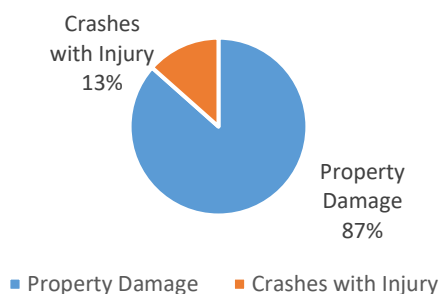
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area November 2025



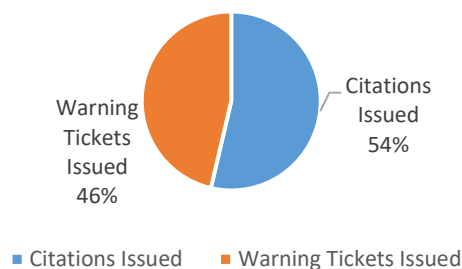

Mental Health Co-Responder

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

Aviation successfully located an elderly dementia patient that was missing in early November. Air1 located her in a neighbor's field and landed to make contact with her until other units arrived on foot. They also performed overwatch on multiple traffic stops for Patrol and assisted them in locating a personal injury accident. They also assisted in a search of a subject who fled from CID personnel. Aviation followed the subject until he bailed on foot in Metro Nashville.

In community interaction, Air1 flew to Sunshine Preschool twice for Touch-a-Truck events and for Mill Creek Elementary Career Day. They also performed a funeral flyover for the flight nurse lost in the Life Flight crash, a parade flyover for the Veterans Day Parade, and flyovers for two Brentwood Academy football games.

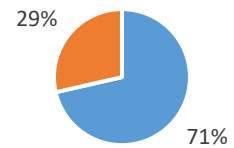

November 2025



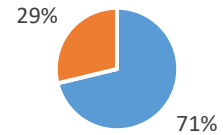
■ Avg Male Pop ■ Avg Female Pop

November 2025



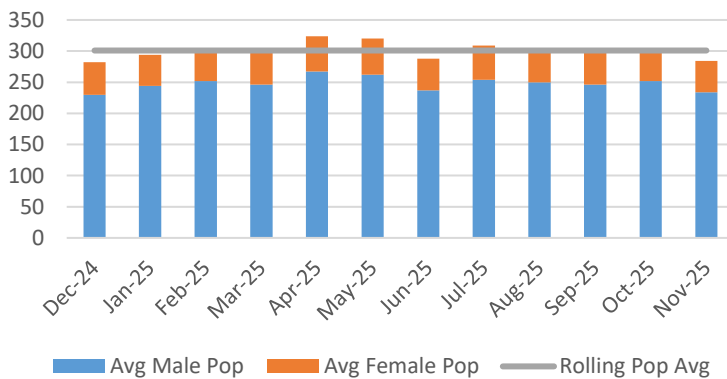
■ Males Booked ■ Females Booked
