Hiring and Retention Efforts

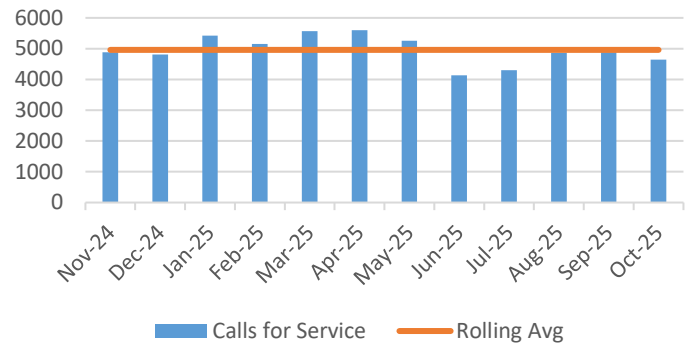

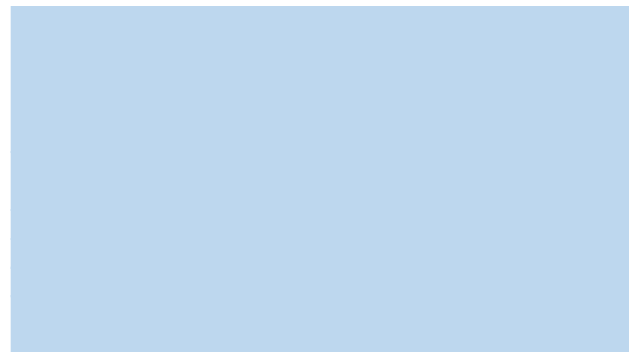

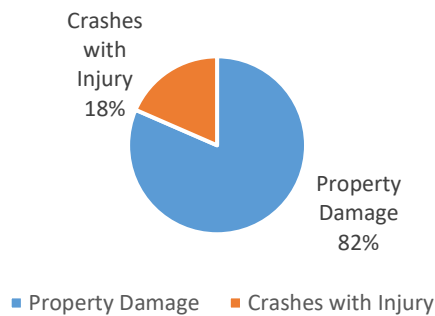
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area October 2025



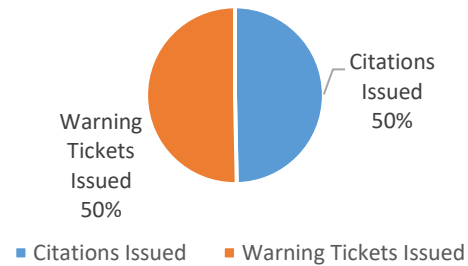

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

October was a busy month for flying, where Aviation worked with other WCSO divisions as well as outside agencies. They performed training flights and proactive air patrols, assisted Patrol Division with overwatch for multiple traffic stops, and searched for a motor vehicle crash. Air1 was called to search on two missing juvenile incidents and a search for a domestic assault suspect. In multijurisdictional coordination, Aviation assisted Rutherford Co SO to look for a narcotics seizure vehicle, and searched for a missing male in Cheatham County. Unfortunately, the male was found deceased. When the disastrous Humphreys County explosion occurred, Air1 assisted ATF in flying agents overhead for aerial photos and flew state senators to observe the site. Finally, there were ample community engagement opportunities including a Touch-a-Truck event at Bowie Nature Park, a flyover at the Westhaven Golf Tournament, a Heritage Elementary safety event, an event at Brightstone, Nolensville Night Out, and Sunset Elementary's Fall Fest. The helicopters were also present for career day events at Thompson's Station, Creekside, and Battle Creek Elementary Schools.

Crime Prevention

Crime Prevention had an exceptionally busy month of community engagement and educational outreach across our county. In DARE Program, Pearre Creek Elementary had lesson three and Allendale Elementary had lesson four; all continue to demonstrate great enthusiasm and program engagement. Berry's Chapel Preschool kicked off the month with their annual Touch-a-Truck. Winstead and Bethesda Elementary Schools held fall festivals, and Brightstone Center hosted an EMS Day which provided their adult students a hands-on opportunity with emergency vehicles and personnel. Thompson's Station Middle School invited WCSO to speak during Red Ribbon Week with a focus on the importance of bike and walking safety. Franklin Kiddie Academy also hosted a visit from WCSO, and Fairview Elementary hosted our presentation on seatbelt safety.

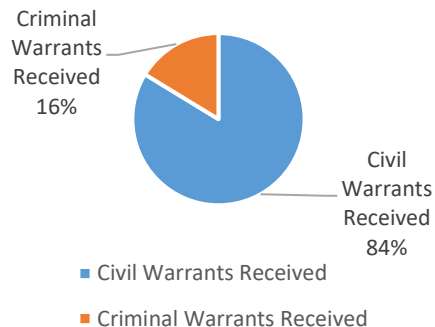

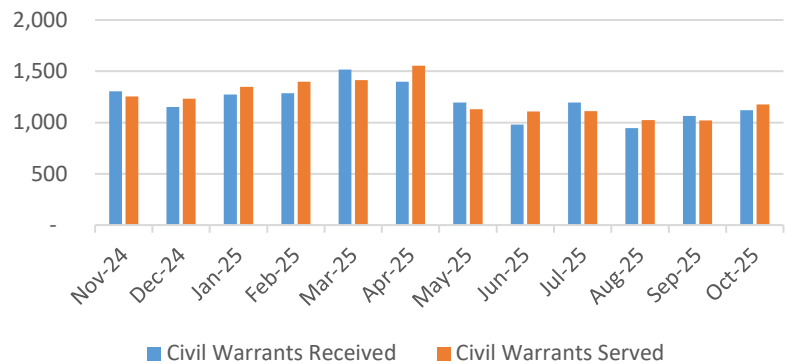

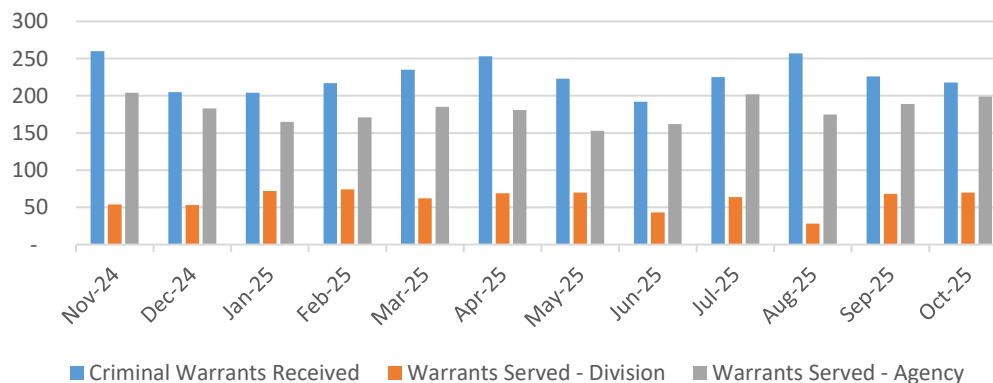
Warrants Received by WCSO

Civil Warrants Received & Served



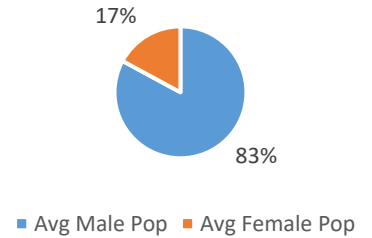
Criminal Warrants Received & Served



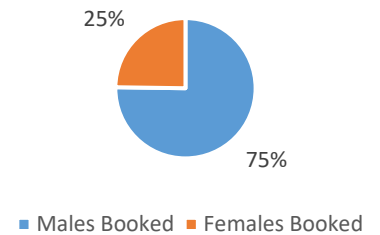

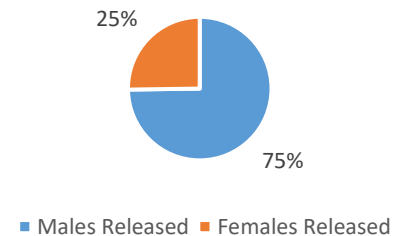
Population Averages
October 2025



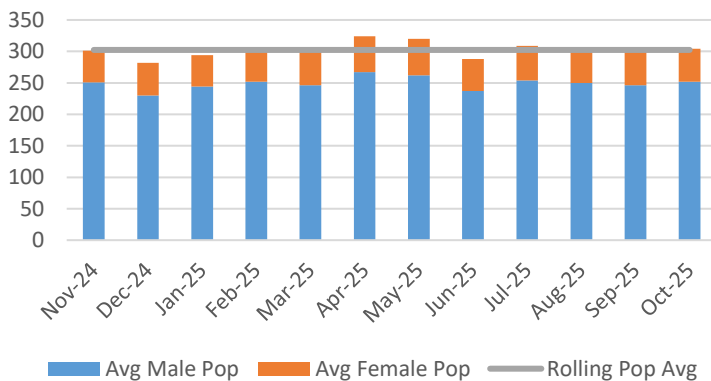
Detention Bookings
