Hiring and Retention Efforts

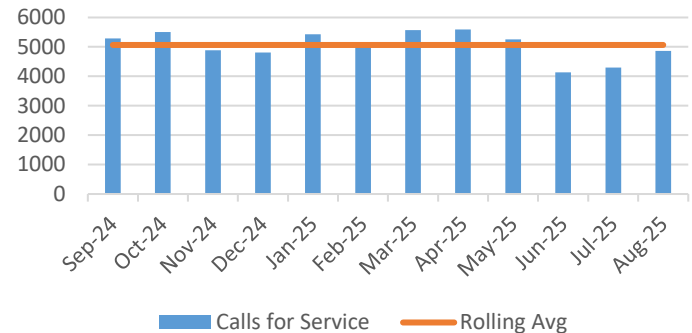
WCSO received 62 applications and initiated 9 backgrounds. There were 3 new hires into Detention (1), Patrol (1), and SRO (1). The increased applications in August were primarily in response to a civilian administrative assistant posting for CID. 8 people also left employment with WCSO: 1 retired, 1 resigned to work for Franklin PD, 1 moved out of state, 1 was terminated, 2 resigned in lieu of termination, 1 resigned after one month of detention work, and 1 part-time crossing guard resigned for health reasons.

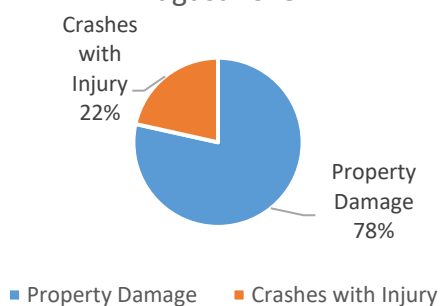
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area August 2025



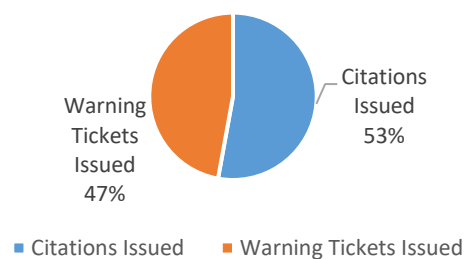

Mental Health Co-Responder

Since 2022, WCSO partners with Volunteer Behavioral Health Care System through grant funding for a co-responder program to improve response to mental health crises in this county. The co-responder position is vacant as of the end of September 2024. WCSO is utilizing Tennessee's Mobile Crisis Services when needed until VBHCS fills this position or an alternative solution is identified. No co-responder monthly data is available during this vacancy (October 2024 to current).

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

Aviation kept a focus on proactive patrolling and training flights during August. They also assisted Patrol Division with a disorder involving a weapon, a traffic stop where a vehicle occupant had active warrants, and a reckless driver BOLO. Air1 was dispatched specifically for incidents to locate a suicidal subject, and to look for a stolen vehicle. Additionally, they assisted Warrants Division with a warrant service, and assisted them on another date with checking for vehicles around a residence.

Crime Prevention

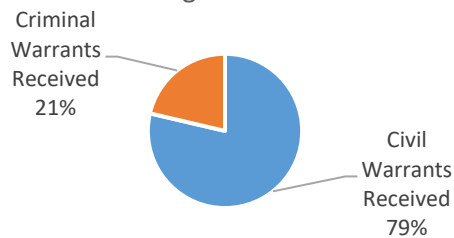
Crime Prevention's headline event in August is always the Williamson County Fair. Personnel across the divisions worked community hours in the fair booth. This was done with the intention that deputies from Court Services, Detention, Warrants, SRO, etc. that do not routinely interact with large public groups would have an opportunity to speak with our citizens about their daily duties and experiences with WCSO. We also enjoyed time with our community members when we hosted *Shakes with a Sheriff's Deputy* at the Berry Farms Sonic this month. The DARE program in Williamson County Schools has entered its second year. Hillsboro School officially requested to become the third county school to join the program, along with inaugural schools Allendale and Pearre Creek. They will begin their program in September. Monthly convenience center checks were conducted for litterbag supply restock and equipment inspection/replacement. Crime Prevention spent approximately 19.25 hours in community immersion for the month.

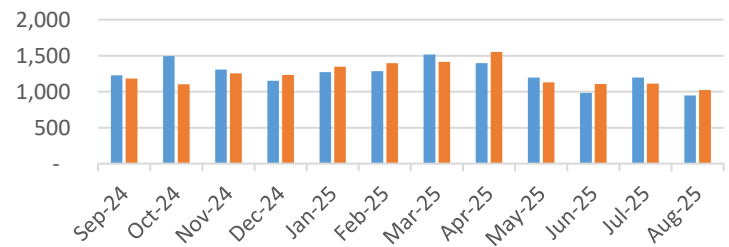

August 2025



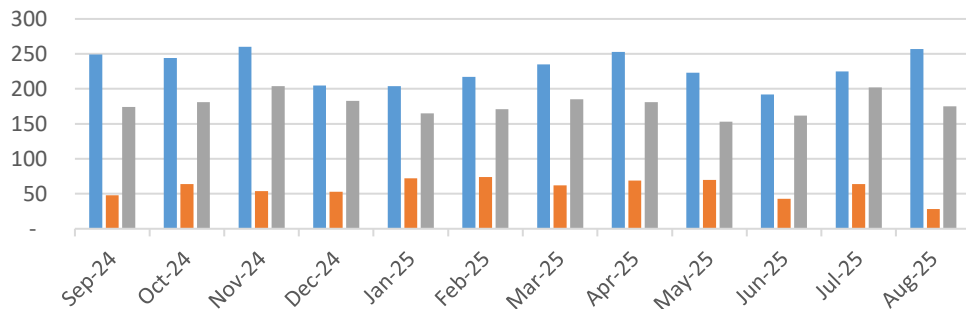

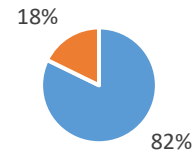

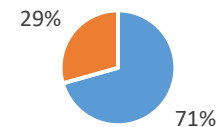

August 2025



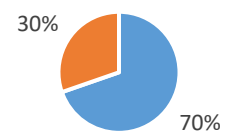
■ Avg Male Pop ■ Avg Female Pop

August 2025



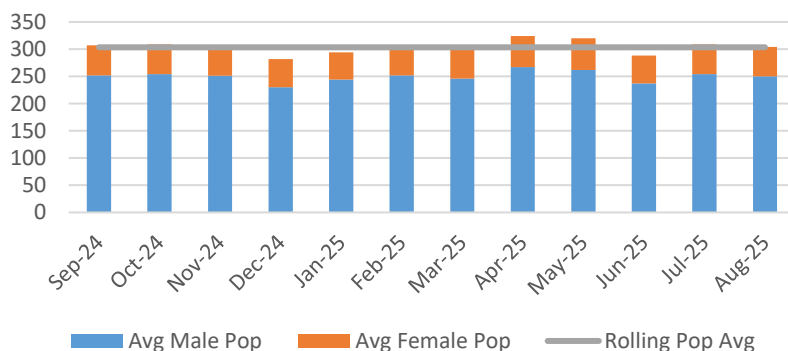
■ Males Booked ■ Females Booked
