Hiring and Retention Efforts

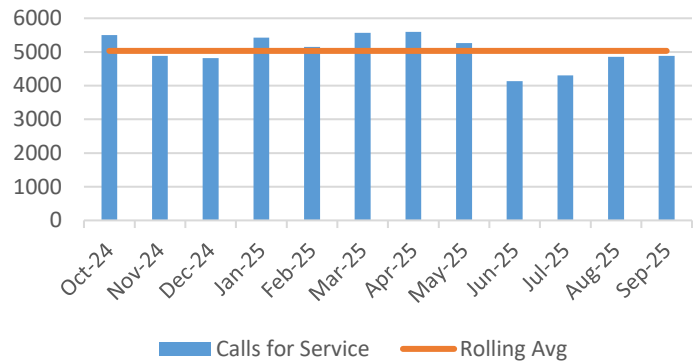

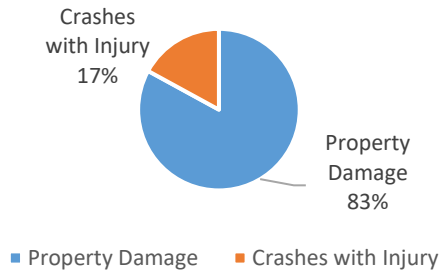
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area September 2025



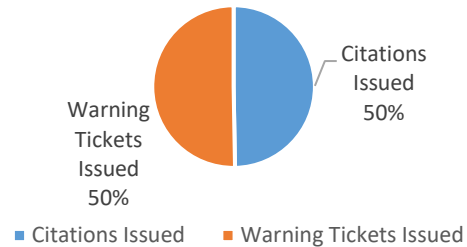

Crime Prevention

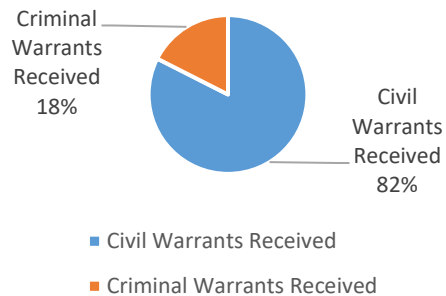
Crime Prevention provided the first DARE lesson this month to Hillsboro School, while Pearre Creek completed lesson #2 and Allendale Elementary completed lesson #3. College Grove Elementary will be joining the DARE program next school year, and received internet safety lectures this month. A visit to Inge-Smith Preschool took place at the beginning of the month where students learned the basic functions of the Sheriff's Office. There was also a Touch-a-Truck portion of the visit, allowing the students to see an emergency response vehicle up close. At the end of the month, WCSO hosted a Car Seat Safety Check Event in partnership with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office. This event was a great success, giving peace of mind to both parents and law enforcement by confirming that young children are safe inside of their vehicles while on our local roads. Participating agencies also shared free giveaway items and had their first responder vehicles on display. Monthly convenience center checks occurred for litterbag supply restock and equipment inspection/replacement. Crime Prevention spent approximately 24 hours in community immersion for the month.

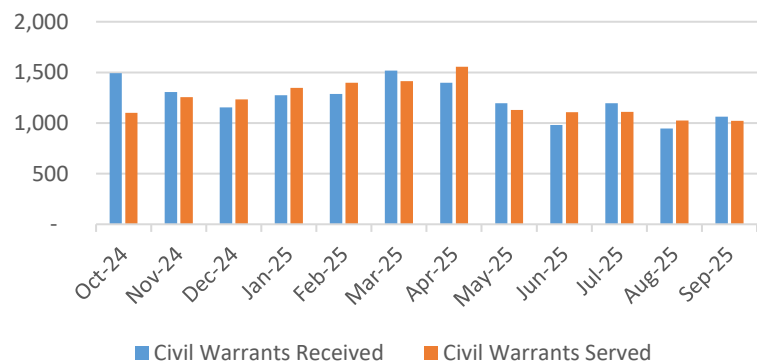

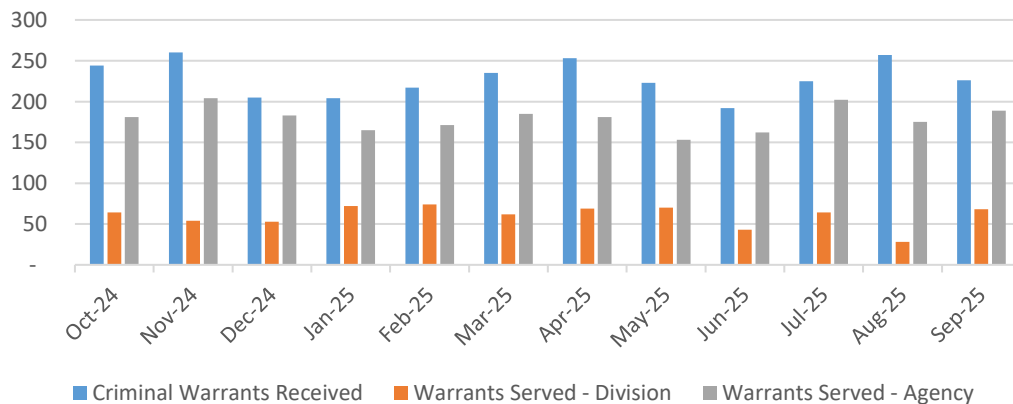
Warrants Received by WCSO

Civil Warrants Received & Served



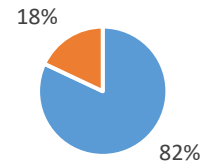
Criminal Warrants Received & Served

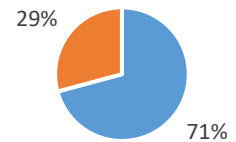

September 2025



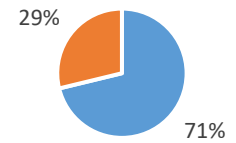
■ Avg Male Pop ■ Avg Female Pop

September 2025



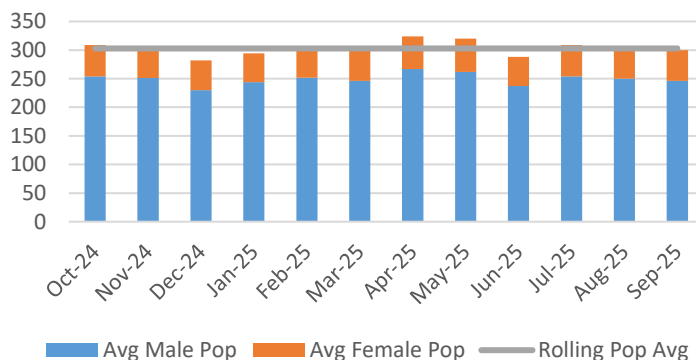
■ Males Booked ■ Females Booked
